The Maryland Reentry Initiative

Program Goal:

To develop and administer connections between American Job Centers (AJCs), businesses, community-based organizations, and correctional facilities to assist justice-involved citizens in locating self-sustaining employment.



Reentry Navigator Roles and Responsibilities

- Primary point of contact in the AJC for returning citizens, connects justiceinvolved jobseekers with community resources.
- Serves as the face of the AJC inside state and local correctional facilities, sharing career resources with individuals prior to their release to the community.



Reentry Navigator Roles and Responsibilities

- Interfaces with local businesses to locate job opportunities for returning citizens and to spread awareness of the justice-involved talent pool in Maryland.
- Coordinates local reentry resources on behalf of jobseekers and employers in the region.
- Provides a boots on the ground assessment for program staff and agency leadership.

Correctional Education

Maryland's Correctional Education Program seeks to...

Move incarcerated students from prison to middle income.







Three main units within the Office of Correctional Education:

- Academic
- Occupational
- Transitional

Pilot Program Implementation

MD Labor initially deployed five Reentry Navigators throughout the State as a pilot in 2019:

- Three local areas with state correctional facilities
 - Eastern Shore
 - Western Maryland
 - Anne Arundel County
- Two with large returning citizen population
 - Prince George's County
 - Baltimore City

Program Expansion

Due to the success of the pilot, MD Labor expanded the program in 2022, adding six more Reentry Navigators to serve the remaining local areas in Maryland.

Outreach is focused on:

- Local detention centers
- Homeless centers
- Community-based organizations

Specialty Services for the Reentry Population

- Federal Bonding Program
- Assistance with homelessness
- Resources for free legal assistance
- Work with local businesses to connect justiceinvolved citizens to fill jobs and/or apprenticeship opportunities
- Connect with correctional facilities to provide education about services available upon release
- Work Opportunity Tax Credit
- Access to Support Services
- Child support and modification

- Expungement workshop opportunities
- Clothes referrals
- Document replacement
- Career guidance
- Job search assistance

Outcomes – Performance Metrics

Data for 1/23 - 3/23

- Employment 2nd Quarter after Exit 60.1%
- Employment 4th Quarter after Exit 65.1%
- Median Wages \$6070.00
- # Returning Citizens served 299
- # Bonding letters issued 70
- # Business Outreach Contacts 1251
